The City of Twentynine Palms recently engaged a public relations firm to develop, distribute and analyze a poll to assess satisfaction with the City's limited services and level of support for investing in a centralized sewer system, and take-over of the Twentynine Palms Water District. Distribution of the survey was limited to 300 residents identified as "likely voters" in the City (approximately 1% of the City's population) and 50 or so residents in the unincorporated area of Desert Heights.



The Twentynine Palms Water District (*District*) does not feel that a takeover of the District, giving control of the District's water operations to the City of 29 Palms, is in the best interest of the community. The poll questions asked community members about their satisfaction with the City's limited services and were framed to lead community

members to believe that there would be financial benefit to consolidating the District.
